Seeing Through Different Lenses: Embracing Cultural Perspectives

Why it Matters:

In her TEDx talk, Doan Huynh reminds us that when we acknowledge and appreciate different cultural perspectives, we gain a deeper understanding of the world and of ourselves. Every culture carries unique values, beliefs, and ways of communicating – and learning to see through those lenses helps us connect more meaningfully with others. In a diverse and global society, empathy and openness are essential. By embracing multiple worldviews, we move beyond stereotypes and build communities grounded in respect, compassion, and shared humanity.

SEL Focus Skills

- **Cultural Understanding** – Recognize that every culture offers its own way of seeing and interpreting the world. Appreciating these differences helps build mutual respect.
- **Empathy in Perspective-Taking** – Learn to see situations through the eyes of others whose experiences differ from yours.
- **Curiosity with Compassion** – Be genuinely interested in learning about others' beliefs, values, and traditions – not to compare, but to connect.
- **Open Dialogue** – Engage in respectful conversations where diverse opinions can be shared and heard without judgment.
- **Global Connection** – Realize that understanding other worldviews strengthens not only your relationships but also your ability to contribute to a more inclusive world.

Practical Tips for Students

- **Listen to Learn, Not to Reply** – When someone shares their cultural experience, focus on understanding before responding.
- **Avoid Assumptions** – Remember that gestures, words, or behaviors can mean different things in different cultures.
- **Celebrate Diversity** – Treat cultural differences as learning opportunities, not barriers.
- **Ask with Respect** – If you're unsure about a custom or belief, inquire politely and with genuine interest.
- **Be a Bridge** – Use what you learn to promote inclusivity and understanding in your class and community.

Germs can be spread when a person touches something contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose, or mouth.

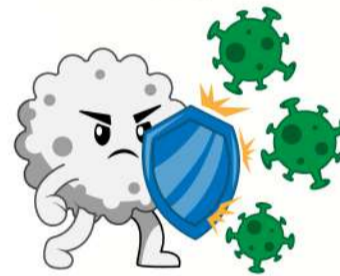


Take steps for cleaner air
